


#### THE LESSONS FOR USE ON THE CHRIST THE KING SUNDAY ~ YEAR A Psalm 100 • Ephesians 1:15-23 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18

WE AFFIRM THE FOLLOWING:

- The Holy Trinity of God Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

Question: What is Christ the King Sunday, and why do we celebrate it as a Church?



Christ the King Sunday is the last Sunday of the Christian

Church year, and it ends our scriptural journey through the fifty-twoweek lectionary series of Bible readings. In addition to closing out the liturgical cycle, it simultaneously moves us to the threshold of Advent and the season of Christmas. As the pinnacle of the Church calendar, the theme of Christ the King Sunday centers on the crucified and risen Jesus, whom God exalted to rule over the whole universe. Today points us back to Christ's Resurrection and Ascension to the right hand of God in Heaven, from where He is presently reigning. But that's not all - Christ the King Sunday also directs us ahead to His Second Coming as the King of kings and Lord of lords when He will not only reign supreme but defeat every enemy of the faith.

As our sovereign ruler, Christ calls us to a loyalty transcending every earthly claim on the human heart. To Him alone belongs the supreme allegiance in our lives as we are called to stand with those who, in every age, confessed, "Jesus Christ is Lord!" In every generation, despots and demagogues emerge to claim the loyalty and obedience that belongs only to God. But Christ alone has the right to claim our highest devotion - the blood of martyrs, past and present, witnesses to this truth. For Christians, when our faith is repeatedly marginalized in public life, we can fall into the habit of compartmentalizing our faith. We claim we love Jesus in our private lives, but we shrink from acknowledging the kingship of Christ in social life. However, when we celebrate Christ the King Sunday, we declare to the world and remind ourselves that Jesus is not only the Lord of the Church but of the entire universe and over every element of our individual lives. Yes, our world is a frightening place; war, violence, terrorism, and the unpredictable setbacks in family, marriage, health, and business keep us all on the edge of our seats. But our God is not in Heaven wringing His hands - he never looks at the day's headlines and says, "Boy, I didn't see that coming." No - our Christian faith is built on the conviction that our Lord Jesus Christ has a cosmic sovereignty. And we do not need to wait for some coming day when his reign will begin. It is in place NOW, despite all appearances to the contrary.



NIKA is connected to the Greek word for victory. When it appears as four pairs of letters in four squares divided around a cross, it represents the phrase: JESUS CHRIST CONQUERS THROUGH THE CROSS.


