In Reformed theology, The Lord's Supper is a sacrament that strengthens the spiritual connection between Christians and Christ through the outward or physical action of eating bread and drinking wine. According to the Reformed confessions, Christ's body and blood are really present in this sacrament, but not in the way the Roman Catholic Church thinks.

The great reformer Martin Luther rejected the Roman Catholic doctrine of transubstantiation (that the bread and wine of the Eucharist materially change into Christ's body and blood,) but continued to hold that Christ is really present "in, with, and under the bread and wine". Early Reformed theologians such as John Calvin and Huldrych Zwingli also rejected the Roman Catholic belief in transubstantiation, but taught that Christ's person, including his body and blood, are presented to Christians who partake of it in faith. For the Reformed, Christ's presence is believed to be communicated spiritually rather than by his body being physically eaten. The Reformed doctrine of real presence is called "pneumatic presence" (from pneuma, a Greek word for spirit; alternatively called "spiritual real presence" or "mystical real presence").

John Calvin believed the Lord's Supper fed Christians with the spiritual food of union with Christ, which he saw as an inexplicable miracle. Calvin taught that the Supper confirms the promises communicated to Christians by the Holy Spirit in the preaching of the Gospel. He also saw its purpose as provoking praise for God and love for other people.

In Reformed churches, only baptized, believing Christians are to partake of the Lord's Supper. They also must examine and prepare themselves for the sacrament. This involves acknowledging one's sinfulness as well as a faith in Christ to forgive those sins.

The Lord's Supper traces its roots to the Passover meal at the Exodus and the deliverance of the people of God from Egypt. God visited judgment on Egypt, but he provided a means of salvation for his chosen people. As a sign of God's deliverance, the Israelites painted the blood from a slaughtered lamb on the doorframes of their houses. The angel of death spared the homes where the lamb's blood was visible on the doorframes. In a very tangible sense, the lamb died instead of the firstborn son of the household.

Jesus gave a new meaning to the traditional Passover meal during his last supper with his disciples, which took place just before his arrest. He accomplished this by using the traditional bread and wine of the Sedar Meal to represent his body and blood. The blood is now the "blood of the covenant" – the new covenant that Jesus would institute through his death and resurrection. As the Passover meal served as a foundational meal of the old covenant, the Lord's Supper is the foundational meal of the new covenant. The Passover meal reminded people of how God saved them from slavery in Egypt. Similarly, the Lord's Supper reminds us of how Jesus saved us from sin.


