The Lessons for Use on the TWENTY-THIRD SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST ~ YEAR A Micah 3:5-12 • Psalm 43 1 Thessalonians 2:12-20


Communion is an ordinance started by Jesus during His Last Supper with His disciples. Communion is a way for believers to outwardly show their love for and fellowship with Christ, to remember the atoning sacrifice that Jesus made for them, and to look forward to the time when He will partake with us in the kingdom.



God's provision of the Lord's Supper is part of a long-standing pattern of his gracious dealings with his people throughout history. Just as God has always made covenants with his people, so also God has always given covenant signs and covenant meals to his people. In all of God's covenants, he has given his people tangible signs or tokens tied to the promises that he has made with them. God has also appointed meals for his covenant people to help them appreciate his goodness and abundance in the gospel. God appeals to us through our five senses—sight, hearing, touch, taste, and smell—to encourage us to believe the good news that he offers us in the promises of the gospel. God has never chosen at random the physical elements that have made up the signs he appointed for his covenants, and it is no accident that he has appointed meals throughout redemptive history for his people.

After the death, resurrection, and ascension of Jesus, the early church obeyed the words of Jesus and practiced the ordinance of Communion, the eating of bread (symbolizing His body), and the drinking of wine (symbolizing His blood). Later, Paul the apostle brought out the idea of covenant fellowship during Communion, writing: "Is not the cup of thanksgiving for which we give thanks a participation in the blood of Christ? And is not the bread that we break a participation in the body of Christ? Because there is one loaf, we, who are many, are one body, for we all share the one loaf" (1 Corinthians 10:16–17).

Communion is a time for reflection, not only on an individual's sin and need for forgiveness but on the covenant grace and love that Christ exhibited on the cross. As Christians partake in Communion together, they demonstrate their covenantal union with each other and Christ. Christians are reminded of Christ's sacrifice and remind each other that He is coming again as they share in Communion together. Communion is a "common sharing in the Spirit" (Philippians 2:1) and an answer to Jesus' prayer "that they may be one as We are one—I in them and You in Me—that they may be perfectly united" (John 17:22-23.) In Communion, the church not only meets Jesus' commandment, but it also contributes to the unity of all believers.


